Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

December 2011

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended December 10, 2011, there were 523,500 persons employed in Saskatchewan during December 2011, a decrease of 700 from November 2011 but 3,100 more than the number employed in December 2010.

Agricultural employment was 35,700 persons in December 2011, down 2,400 from the November 2011 level and 500 less than the December 2010 agricultural employment level of 36,200. Non-agricultural employment was 487,800 persons in December 2011. This is an increase of 1,700 from the November 2011 non-agriculture employment level of 486,100 and 3,600 more than December 2010.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for December 2011 was 4.7 percent. This is unchanged from the November 2011 rate and 0.2 percentage points lower than the December 2010 level of 4.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 400 to 549,600 persons in December 2011 from 550,000 persons in November 2011. This is 2,000 more than the December 2010 labour force of 547,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> fell 0.1 percentage points to 68.3 percent in December 2011 from 68.4 percent in November 2011. The December 2010 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.8 percent.

There were 26,100 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during December 2011. This is an increase of 300 from November 2011 but is 1,000 less than the number unemployed in December 2010.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 527,800 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in December 2011, up 3,100 from the November 2011 level of 524,700 and up 3,700 from the December 2010 employment level of 524,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>seasonally adjusted</u> <u>unemployment rate</u> for December 2011 was 5.2 percent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the November 2011 rate of 5.1 percent but 0.3 percentage points lower than the December 2010 rate of 5.5 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian <u>employment</u> decreased by 44,700 persons in December 2011 to 17,271,700 persons from 17,316,400 persons in November 2011. In December 2010, there were 17,087,200 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> decreased 0.1 percentage points in December 2011 to 6.9 percent from the November 2011 level of 7.0 percent. In December 2010, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.0 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.5 percent in December 2011. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than November 2011 but 0.1 percentage points lower than the December 2010 level of 7.6 percent.
