Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

July 2010

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended July 17, 2010, there were 532,100 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during July 2010, a decrease of 7,600 from June 2010 but 5,800 more than the number employed in July 2009.

Agricultural employment was 43,900 persons in July 2010, up 300 from the June 2010 level but 1,300 less than the July 2009 agricultural employment level of 45,200. Non-agricultural employment was 488,200 persons in July 2010. This is a decrease of 7,900 from the June 2010 non-agriculture employment level of 496,100 but 7,100 more than July 2009.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for July 2010 was 5.4 percent. This is an increase of 0.5 percentage points from the June 2010 rate of 4.9 percent and 0.2 percentage points higher than the July 2009 level of 5.2 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> decreased by 4,600 to 562,700 persons in July 2010 from 567,300 persons in June 2010. This is 7,800 more than the July 2009 labour force of 554,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.7 percentage points to 71.0 percent in July 2010 from 71.7 percent in June 2010. The July 2009 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 71.1 percent.

There were 30,600 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during July 2010. This is an increase of 2,900 from June 2010 and is 2,000 more than the number unemployed in July 2009.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis, there were 526,000 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in July 2010, down 2,100 from the June 2010 level of 528,100 but is up 7,300 from the July 2009 employment level of 518,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for July 2010 was 5.1 percent. This is a decrease of 0.4 percentage points from the June 2010 rate of 5.5 percent but 0.3 percentage points higher than the July 2009 rate of 4.8 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 79,900 persons in July 2010 to 17,454,300 persons from 17,534,200 persons in June 2010. In July 2009, there were 17,070,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.9 percentage points to 8.3 percent from the June 2010 level of 7.4 percent. In July 2009, Canada's unemployment rate was 8.9 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 8.0 percent in July 2010. This is 0.1 percentage points higher than June 2010 but is 0.6 percentage points lower than the July 2009 level of 8.6 percent.
