

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

January 2009

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended January 17, 2009, there were 512,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan during January 2009, a decrease of 3,400 from December 2008 but 16,600 more than the number employed in January 2008.

Agricultural employment was 39,100 persons in January 2009, up 2,300 from the December 2008 level and 2,800 more than the January 2008 agricultural employment level of 36,300. Non-agricultural employment was 473,500 persons in January 2009. This is a decrease of 5,700 from the December 2008 non-agriculture employment level of 479,200 but 13,800 more than January 2008.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for January 2009 was 4.6 percent. This is an increase of 0.6 percentage points from the December 2008 rate of 4.0 percent and 0.1 percentage points higher than the January 2008 level of 4.5 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 300 to 537,100 persons in January 2009 from 537,400 persons in December 2008. This is 17,800 more than the January 2008 labour force of 519,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.1 percentage points to 69.3 percent in January 2009 from 69.4 percent in December 2008. The January 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 68.3 percent.

There were 24,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during January 2009. This is an increase of 3,200 from December 2008 and is 1,300 more than the number unemployed in January 2008.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 521,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan in January 2009, up 1,600 from the December 2008 level of 520,300 and is up 15,600 from the January 2008 employment level of 506,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for January 2009 was 4.1 percent. This is a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the December 2008 rate of 4.2 percent but 0.2 percentage points higher than the January 2008 rate of 3.9 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 409,600 persons in January 2009 to 16,600,900 persons from 17,010,500 persons in December 2008. In January 2008, there were 16,710,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate increased 1.5 percentage points to 7.8 percent from the December 2008 level of 6.3 percent. In January 2008, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.3 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 7.2 percent in January 2009. This is 0.6 percentage points higher than December 2008 and 1.4 percentage points higher than the January 2008 level of 5.8 percent.
