

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

June 2009

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended June 20, 2009, there were 535,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan during June 2009, an increase of 5,500 from May 2009 and 14,500 more than the number employed in June 2008.

Agricultural employment was 44,400 persons in June 2009, down 1,100 from the May 2009 level and 1,900 more than the June 2008 agricultural employment level of 42,500. Non-agricultural employment was 491,200 persons in June 2009. This is an increase of 6,600 from the May 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 484,600 and 12,600 more than June 2008.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for June 2009 was 3.9 percent. This is a decrease of 1.0 percentage points from the May 2009 rate of 4.9 percent but 0.5 percentage points higher than the June 2008 level of 3.4 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 200 to 557,500 persons in June 2009 from 557,700 persons in May 2009. This is 18,000 more than the June 2008 labour force of 539,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 0.2 percentage points to 71.5 percent in June 2009 from 71.7 percent in May 2009. The June 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.4 percent.

There were 21,900 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during June 2009. This is a decrease of 5,700 from May 2009 but is 3,500 more than the number unemployed in June 2008.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 524,800 persons employed in Saskatchewan in June 2009, up 1,600 from the May 2009 level of 523,200 and is up 14,800 from the June 2008 employment level of 510,000 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for June 2009 was 4.6 percent. This is a decrease of 0.3 percentage points from the May 2009 rate of 4.9 percent and 0.6 percentage points higher than the June 2008 rate of 4.0 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 206,400 persons in June 2009 to 17,158,700 persons from 16,952,300 persons in May 2009. In June 2008, there were 17,499,400 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.6 percentage points to 8.1 percent from the May 2009 level of 8.7 percent. In June 2008, Canada's unemployment rate was 5.6 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 8.6 percent in June 2009. This is 0.2 percentage points higher than May 2009 and 2.4 percentage points higher than the June 2008 level of 6.2 percent.
