## Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

November 2009

#### **UNADJUSTED DATA**

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended November 14, 2009, there were 521,600 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan during November 2009, an increase of 1,000 from October 2009 and 900 more than the number employed in November 2008.

Agricultural employment was 44,600 persons in November 2009, down 2,100 from the October 2009 level but 2,600 more than the November 2008 agricultural employment level of 42,000. Non-agricultural employment was 477,000 persons in November 2009. This is an increase of 3,100 from the October 2009 non-agriculture employment level of 473,900 but 1,700 less than November 2008.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for November 2009 was 4.5 percent. This is an increase of 0.1 percentage points from the October 2009 rate of 4.4 percent and 1.3 percentage points higher than the November 2008 level of 3.2 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> increased by 1,500 to 546,200 persons in November 2009 from 544,700 persons in October 2009. This is 8,100 more than the November 2008 labour force of 538,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> rose 0.1 percentage points to 69.7 percent in November 2009 from 69.6 percent in October 2009. The November 2008 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.6 percent.

There were 24,600 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during November 2009. This is an increase of 500 from October 2009 and is 7,200 more than the number unemployed in November 2008.

#### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 519,500 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in November 2009, up 1,800 from the October 2009 level of 517,700 but is down 800 from the November 2008 employment level of 520,300 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for November 2009 was 5.2 percent. This is a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the October 2009 rate of 5.3 percent but 1.4 percentage points higher than the November 2008 rate of 3.8 percent.

#### **CANADIAN DATA**

Canadian <u>employment</u> increased by 14,700 persons in November 2009 to 16,924,100 persons from 16,909,400 persons in October 2009. In November 2008, there were 17,117,800 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.4 percentage points to 8.0 percent from the October 2009 level of 7.6 percent. In November 2008, Canada's unemployment rate was 6.2 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 8.5 percent in November 2009. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than October 2009 but 2.1 percentage points higher/lower than the November 2008 level of 6.4 percent.
