

# Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

June 2008

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## UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended June 21, 2008, there were 521,100 persons employed in Saskatchewan during June 2008, an increase of 3,600 from May 2008 and 11,200 more than the number employed in June 2007.

Agricultural employment was 42,500 persons in June 2008, down 1,900 from the May 2008 level and 2,800 less than the June 2007 agricultural employment level of 45,300. Non-agricultural employment was 478,600 persons in June 2008. This is an increase of 5,500 from the May 2008 non-agriculture employment level of 473,100 and 14,000 more than June 2007.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for June 2008 was 3.4 percent. This is a decrease of 0.6 percentage points from the May 2008 rate of 4.0 percent and 0.5 percentage points lower than the June 2007 level of 3.9 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force increased by 800 to 539,500 persons in June 2008 from 538,700 persons in May 2008. This is 9,000 more than the June 2007 labour force of 530,500 persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate was 70.4 percent June 2008, unchanged from May 2008. The June 2007 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.7 percent.

There were 18,400 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during June 2008. This is a decrease of 2,900 from May 2008 and is 2,200 less than the number unemployed in June 2007.

## SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 509,600 persons employed in Saskatchewan in June 2008, up 200 from the May 2008 level of 509,400 and is up 11,700 from the June 2007 employment level of 497,900 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for June 2008 was 4.0 percent. This is a decrease of 0.1 percentage points from the May 2008 rate of 4.1 percent and 0.4 percentage points lower than the June 2007 rate of 4.4 percent.

## CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment increased by 209,600 persons in June 2008 to 17,499,400 persons from 17,289,800 persons in May 2008. In June 2007, there were 17,195,500 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.6 percentage points to 5.6 percent from the May 2008 level of 6.2 percent. In June 2007, Canada's unemployment rate 5.6 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.2 percent in June 2008. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than May 2008 as well as 0.1 percentage points lower than the June 2007 level of 6.1 percent.
