

Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

September 2008

UNADJUSTED DATA

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey for the week ended September 20, 2008, there were 522,500 persons employed in Saskatchewan during September 2008, an increase of 2,900 from August 2008 and 18,100 more than the number employed in September 2007.

Agricultural employment was 47,200 persons in September 2008, up 3,000 from the August 2008 level and 1,200 more than the September 2007 agricultural employment level of 46,000. Non-agricultural employment was 475,300 persons in September 2008. This is a decrease of 100 from the August 2008 non-agriculture employment level of 475,400 and 16,900 more than September 2007.

The Saskatchewan unemployment rate for September 2008 was 3.6 percent. This is a decrease of 1.8 percentage points from the August 2008 rate of 5.4 percent but 0.2 percentage points higher than the September 2007 level of 3.4 percent.

Saskatchewan's labour force decreased by 7,300 to 542,100 persons in September 2008 from 549,400 persons in August 2008. This is 20,000 more than the September 2007 labour force of persons.

The Saskatchewan participation rate fell 1.1 percentage points to 70.3 percent in September 2008 from 71.4 percent in August 2008. The September 2007 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 69.3 percent.

There were 19,600 persons unemployed in Saskatchewan during September 2008. This is a decrease of 10,200 from August 2008 but is 1,900 more than the number unemployed in September 2007.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a seasonally adjusted basis there were 519,200 persons employed in Saskatchewan in September 2008, up 13,800 from the August 2008 level of 505,400 and is up 22,500 from the September 2007 employment level of 496,700 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for September 2008 was 4.1 percent. This is a decrease of 0.4 percentage points from the August 2008 rate of 4.5 percent and 0.2 percentage points higher than the September 2007 rate of 3.9 percent.

CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 161,700 persons in September 2008 to 17,230,200 persons from 17,391,900 persons in August 2008. In September 2007, there were 16,965,200 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's unemployment rate decreased 0.8 percentage points to 5.7 percent from the August 2008 level of 6.5 percent. In September 2007, Canada's unemployment rate was 5.5 percent.

The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Canada was 6.1 percent in September 2008. This is unchanged from August 2008 but is 0.2 percentage points higher than the September 2007 level of 5.9 percent.
