## Saskatchewan Labour Force Statistics

August 2017

### **UNADJUSTED DATA**

According to the Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey during the week covering August 13<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup>, 2017, there were 572,900 persons employed in Saskatchewan. This is a decrease of 1,500 from July 2017 and 1,800 less than the number employed in August 2016.

Agricultural employment was 39,400 persons in August 2017, up 500 from the July 2017 level but 5,500 less than the August 2016 agricultural employment level of 44,900. Non-agricultural employment was 533,500 persons in August 2017. This is a decrease of 2,000 from the July 2017 non-agriculture employment level of 535,500 but 3,700 more than in August 2016.

The Saskatchewan <u>unemployment rate</u> for August 2017 was 6.9 percent. This is an increase of 0.3 percentage points from the July 2017 rate of 6.6 percent and 0.1 percentage points higher than the August 2016 level of 6.8 percent.

Saskatchewan's <u>labour force</u> increased by 500 to 615,500 persons in August 2017 from 615,000 persons in July 2017. This is 1,100 less than the August 2016 labour force of 616,600 persons.

The Saskatchewan <u>participation rate</u> remained unchanged at 70.1 percent in August 2017 from July 2017. The August 2016 participation rate for Saskatchewan was 70.8 percent.

There were 42,600 persons <u>unemployed</u> in Saskatchewan during August 2017. This is an increase of 2,000 from July 2017 and 600 more than the number unemployed in August 2016.

### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED DATA

On a <u>seasonally adjusted</u> basis there were 568,100 persons <u>employed</u> in Saskatchewan in August 2017, up 100 from the July 2017 level of 568,000 but down 1,000 from the August 2016 employment level of 569,100 persons.

The Saskatchewan seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for August 2017 was 6.4 percent. This is a decrease of 0.2 percentage points from the July 2017 rate of 6.6 percent and 0.1 percentage points lower than the August 2016 rate of 6.5 percent.

### CANADIAN DATA

Canadian employment decreased by 23,600 persons in August 2017 to 18,675,200 persons from 18,698,800 persons in July 2017. In August 2016, there were 18,296,600 persons employed in Canada.

Canada's <u>unemployment rate</u> increased 0.3 percentage points in August 2017 to 6.8 percent from the July 2017 level of 6.5 percent. In August 2016, Canada's unemployment rate was 7.6 percent.

The <u>seasonally adjusted</u> unemployment rate for Canada was 6.2 percent in August 2017. This is 0.1 percentage points lower than July 2017 and 0.8 percentage points lower than the August 2016 level of 7.0 percent.
