Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

February 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.2 percent between January 2017 and February 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.1 percent during the same period.

Price Index advanced 1.4 percent between February 2016 and February 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.6 percent and 1.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer

In Saskatchewan, the February All-items Index decreased from January 2017 primarily due to lower prices for: gasoline; telephone service; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; fresh or frozen chicken; and fresh fruit.

The February All-items Index increased from February 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; electricity; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and water.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for: travel tours; women's clothing; non-electric kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; and children's clothing.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; traveller accommodation; homeowners' replacement cost; cereal products (excluding baby food); and fresh or frozen beef.
