Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between February 2017 and March 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index remained unchanged during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: travel tours; men's clothing; household appliances; women's clothing; and bakery products.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: telephone services; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); personal care supplies and equipment; and gasoline.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.6 percent between March 2016 and March 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.6 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both climbed 0.6 percent during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; electricity; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; travel tours; and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; traveller accommodation; fresh or frozen beef; cereal products (excluding baby food); and other food preparations.
