

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

December 2016

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.2 percent between November 2016 and December 2016 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index fell percent 0.2 and 0.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the December All-items Index decreased from November 2016 primarily due to lower prices for: telephone services; men's clothing; women's clothing; traveller accommodation; and footwear.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; inter-city transportation; fresh or frozen beef; and bakery products.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 0.6 percent between December 2015 and December 2016 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 0.7 percent and 0.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The December All-items Index increased from December 2015 primarily due to higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; gasoline; electricity; furniture; and water.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; natural gas; traveller accommodation; cereal products (excluding baby food); and fresh or frozen beef.
