

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2015

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.3 percent between May 2015 and June 2015 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.4 percent and 0.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index increased from May 2015 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, furniture, traveller accommodation and inter-city transportation. Prices also rose for homeowners' replacement cost, household appliances and other household services.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for men's clothing, women's clothing, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and processed meat. Prices also fell for non-alcoholic beverages, footwear and non-electric kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.9 percent between June 2014 and June 2015 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.9 percent and 2.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2014 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, natural gas, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and food purchased from restaurants. Prices also rose for purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and fresh or frozen beef.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, traveller accommodation, footwear and women's clothing. Prices also fell for fuel oil and other fuels, homeowners' replacement cost and non-electric kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware.
