

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2015

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.1 percent between June 2015 and July 2015 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index fell 0.2 percent and 0.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index decreased from June 2015 primarily due to lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, gasoline, furniture and processed meat. Prices also fell for fresh or frozen beef, mortgage interest cost and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for men's clothing, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, women's clothing and passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs. Prices also rose for traveller accommodation, fresh fruits and fresh vegetables.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.9 percent between July 2014 and July 2015 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.8 percent and 2.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2014 primarily due to higher prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and food purchased from restaurants. Prices also rose for purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, property taxes and other special charges and water.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, footwear, homeowners' replacement cost, fuel oil and other fuels. Prices also fell for non-electric kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware, traveller accommodation and other household supplies.
