

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2014

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.7 percent between February 2014 and March 2014 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.6 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.8 percent and 0.7 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2014 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, women's clothing, footwear and men's clothing. Prices also rose for fresh or frozen beef, fresh or frozen pork and cigarettes.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for travel tours, traveller accommodation, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles and bakery products. Prices also fell for non-prescribed medicines, household textiles and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.8 percent between March 2013 and March 2014 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.7 percent and 2.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2013 primarily due to higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, gasoline, cigarettes and the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles. Prices also rose for electricity, food purchased from restaurants and passenger vehicles insurance premiums.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for seeds, plants and cut flowers, prescribed medicines, telephone services and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles). Prices also fell for clothing accessories, watches and jewellery, passenger vehicle parts, maintenance and repairs and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.
