

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2013

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According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.2 percent between February 2013 and March 2013 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.4 percent and 0.2 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2013 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, cigarettes, women's clothing and children's clothing. Prices also rose for homeowners' replacement cost, fresh fruit and dairy products.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, non-prescribed medicine, fresh vegetables and traveller accommodation. Prices also fell for reading material and other printed matter (excluding textbooks), sugar and confectionary and paper, plastic and foil supplies.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.3 percent between March 2012 and March 2013 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.7 percent and 1.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2012 primarily due to higher prices for rent, purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, electricity and cablevision and satellite services (including pay per view television). Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, passenger vehicles insurance premiums and fresh fruit.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), natural gas and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance. Prices also fell for home entertainment equipment, parts and services, mortgage interest cost and travel tours.
