

# Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

May 2013

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.5 percent between April 2013 and May 2013 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.4 percent and 0.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the May All-items Index increased from April 2013 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, the purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and inter-city transportation. Prices also rose for traveller accommodations, fresh fruit and men's clothing.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, prescribed medicines and women's clothing. Prices also fell for household appliances, non-electrical kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware, non-alcoholic beverages and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.2 percent between May 2012 and May 2013 while the Canada All-items Index increased 0.7 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.5 percent and 0.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The May All-items Index increased from May 2012 primarily due to higher prices for rent, electricity, water and property taxes (including special charges). Prices also rose for food purchased from restaurants, women's clothing and tuition fees.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, recreation equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles) and travel tours. Prices also declined for home entertainment equipment, parts and services, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance and mortgage insurance cost.
