

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

January 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.3 percent between December 2009 and January 2010 while the Canada All-items Index also advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.4 percent and 0.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the January All-items Index increased from December 2009 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, water and natural gas. Prices also rose for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, men's clothing and non-alcoholic beverages.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for travel tours, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), footwear and household chemical products. Prices also fell for fresh fruit, fresh vegetables and dairy products.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.6 percent between January 2009 and January 2010 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.9 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.9 percent and 1.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The January All-items Index increased from January 2009 primarily due to increased prices for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, electricity and rent. Prices also were higher for food purchased from restaurants, prescribed medicines and homeowners' maintenance and repairs.

These increases were partially offset by price decreases for natural gas, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, property taxes (including special charges) and home entertainment equipment – parts and services. Prices were also lower for women's clothing, fresh fruit and fresh vegetables.
