Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

April 2010

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.5 percent between March 2010 and April 2010 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.5 percent and 0.5 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the April All-items Index increased from March 2010 primarily due to higher prices for furniture, cigarettes, and gasoline. Prices also rose for health care services, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, fresh vegetables, and women's clothing.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for dairy products, traveller accommodation, and homeowners' maintenance and repairs. Prices also fell for preserved vegetables and vegetable preparations, preserved fruit and fruit preparations, fresh or frozen chicken, and paper, plastic and foil supplies.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.1 percent between April 2009 and April 2010 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.8 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.2 percent and 1.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The April All-items Index increased from April 2009 primarily due to price increases for gasoline, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, and electricity. Prices also rose for rent, food purchased from restaurants, cigarettes, and passenger vehicle insurance premiums.

These increases were partially offset by price decreases for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, property taxes (including special charges), and natural gas. Prices also declined for home entertainment equipment, parts and services, bakery products, inter-city transportation and fresh vegetables.
