

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

December 2009

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.4 percent between November 2009 and December 2009 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.4 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the December All-items Index decreased from November 2009 primarily due to lower prices for gasoline, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, and home entertainment equipment, parts, and services. Prices also fell for women's clothing, men's clothing, recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), and furniture.

Moderating these decreases were higher prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, fresh vegetables, and bakery products. Prices also rose for other food preparations, household chemical products, rent, and fresh fruit.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.1 percent between December 2008 and December 2009 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.5 percent and 1.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The December All-items Index increased from December 2008 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, electricity, and food purchased from restaurants. Prices also rose for rent, prescribed medicines, homeowners, maintenance and repairs, and the purchase and leasing of recreational vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for natural gas, the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance. Prices also fell for home entertainment equipment, parts, and services, property taxes (including special charges), inter-city transportation, and fresh vegetables.
