

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

January 2008

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between December 2007 and January 2008 while the Canada All-items Index declined 0.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.1 percent and 0.2 percent, respectively, during the same period

In Saskatchewan, the January All-items Index increased from December 2007 primarily due to increased prices for gasoline, women's clothing and water. Prices also rose for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, mortgage interest cost, fresh vegetables and cigarettes.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), purchase and operation of recreational vehicles and purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles. Prices also fell for travel tours, inter-city transportation, electricity, and prescribed medicines.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.2 percent between January 2007 and January 2008 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.7 percent and 4.3 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The January All-items Index increased from January 2007 primarily due to higher prices for housing replacement cost, homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, mortgage interest cost and other owned accommodation expenses. Prices also rose for gasoline, food purchased from restaurants and rent.

These increases were partially offset by decreased prices for purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreation vehicles). Prices also fell for natural gas, fresh fruit, fresh or frozen beef and personal care supplies and equipment.
