

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2008

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.8 percent between February 2008 and March 2008 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.8 percent and 0.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2008 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, housing (replacement cost), mortgage interest cost, and other owned accommodation expenses. Prices also rose for recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles), women's clothing, and food purchased from restaurants.

Moderating these increases were price decreases for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, men's clothing, fresh fruit, and footwear. Prices also fell for preserved fruit and fruit preparations, non-alcoholic beverages, and coffee and tea.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.2 percent between March 2007 and March 2008 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.3 percent and 4.8 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2007 primarily due to higher prices for housing (replacement cost), gasoline, mortgage interest cost, and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance. Prices also rose for other owned accommodation expenses, food purchased from restaurants, and rent.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, natural gas, and fresh fruit. Prices also decreased for fresh vegetables, home entertainment equipment, parts and services, and recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles).
