

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

May 2008

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.7 percent between April 2008 and May 2008 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 1.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 0.9 percent and 0.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the May All-items Index increased from April 2008 primarily due to higher prices for gasoline, housing replacement cost and mortgage interest costs. Prices also rose for traveller accommodations, passenger vehicle insurance premiums, inter-city transportation and fresh fruit.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, women's clothing and men's clothing. Prices also fell for sugar and confectionery, non-alcoholic beverages and homeowners' maintenance and repairs.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.2 percent between May 2007 and May 2008 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.2 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.0 percent and 4.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The May All-items Index increased from May 2007 primarily due to raised prices for housing replacement cost, gasoline and mortgage interest cost. Prices also increased for homeowners' home and mortgage insurance, other owned accommodation expenses, rent and food purchased from restaurants.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for the purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles, passenger vehicle insurance premiums and natural gas. Prices also decreased for recreational equipment and services, purchase and operation of recreational vehicles, fresh fruit and sugar and confectionery.
