

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

August 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.6 percent between July 2017 and August 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose by 0.7 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the August All-items Index increased from July 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: passenger vehicle insurance premiums; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; telephone services; gasoline; and personal care supplies and equipment.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; fresh vegetables; paper, plastic and aluminium foil supplies; inter-city transportation; and non-prescribed medicines.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 1.7 percent between August 2016 and August 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 1.4 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 1.8 percent and 1.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The August All-items Index increased from August 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: food purchased from restaurants; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; cigarettes; and purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; dairy products; men's clothing; home entertainment equipment, parts and services; and paper, plastic and aluminium foil supplies.
