Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

November 2017

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.9 percent between October 2017 and November 2017 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index rose 1.0 percent and 0.9 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.7 percent between November 2016 and November 2017 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both climbed percent 3.9 during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the November All-items Index increased from October 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; furniture; purchase and operation of recreational vehicles; and fresh vegetables.

The November All-items Index increased from November 2016 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; food purchased from restaurants; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; and purchase and operation of recreational vehicles.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: inter-city transportation; processed meat; travel tours; personal care supplies and equipment; and internet access services.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; traveller accommodation; home entertainment, parts and services; processed meat; and preserved fruit and fruit preparations.
