Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

March 2018

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.1 percent between February 2018 and March 2018 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.1 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the March All-items Index increased from February 2018 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; electricity; fresh or frozen chicken; men's clothing; and household appliances.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; telephone services; furniture; fresh vegetables; and non-electric kitchen utensils, tableware and cookware.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.9 percent between March 2017 and March 2018 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.3 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.1 percent and 3.0 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The March All-items Index increased from March 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; food purchased from restaurants; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; and intercity transportation.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: telephone services; furniture; homeowners' replacement cost; travel tours; and fresh or frozen beef.
