

Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

June 2018

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index decreased 0.3 percent between May 2018 and June 2018 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.1 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both fell 0.4 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the June All-items Index decreased from May 2018 primarily due to lower prices for: travel tours; telephone services; children's clothing; men's clothing; and fresh or frozen chicken.

These decreases were partially offset by higher prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; inter-city transportation; fresh vegetables; cigarettes; and non-alcoholic beverages.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 2.7 percent between June 2017 and June 2018 while the Canada All-items Index increased 2.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 2.7 percent and 2.6 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The June All-items Index increased from June 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; homeowners' home and mortgage insurance; and inter-city transportation.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: travel tours; homeowners' replacement cost; telephone services; fresh vegetables; and fresh or frozen chicken.
