Saskatchewan Consumer Price Index

July 2018

According to Statistics Canada, the Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index increased 0.4 percent between June 2018 and July 2018 while the Canada All-items Index advanced 0.5 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index both rose 0.4 percent during the same period.

In Saskatchewan, the July All-items Index increased from June 2018 primarily due to higher prices for: inter-city transportation; telephone services; travel tours; gasoline; and fresh or frozen chicken.

Moderating these increases were lower prices for: purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; women's clothing; fresh or frozen beef; traveller accommodation; and dairy products.

The Saskatchewan All-items Consumer Price Index advanced 3.1 percent between July 2017 and July 2018 while the Canada All-items Index increased 3.0 percent. The Regina and Saskatoon All-items Consumer Price Index climbed 3.3 percent and 3.1 percent, respectively, during the same period.

The July All-items Index increased from July 2017 primarily due to higher prices for: gasoline; inter-city transportation; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; passenger vehicle insurance premiums; and homeowners' home and mortgage insurance.

These increases were partially offset by lower prices for: homeowners' replacement cost; furniture; fresh vegetables; traveller accommodation; and women's clothing.
