

Saskatchewan Place of Work & Commute

2016 Census of Canada

PLACE OF WORK

According to the 2016 Census, 76.3 percent of employed Saskatchewan residents had a usual place of work. This compares with 75.8 percent in 2006. In addition, a higher proportion of Saskatchewan persons had no fixed workplace address (12.6 percent in 2016 versus 9.9 percent in 2006). However, the proportion of Saskatchewan residents working at home dropped from 14.1 percent in 2006 to 10.9 percent in 2016.

Table 1 provides the 2016 and 2006 data for Saskatchewan by place of work characteristics.

The proportion of Saskatchewan residents who work at home (11.2 percent) is nearly double the national average (6.9 percent). This difference can be attributed to the large number of farmers whom live on their land, 56.3 percent of all people in Saskatchewan who reported working from home work as farmers.

MODE OF TRANSPORTATION

Compared to Canada, Saskatchewan residents drive to work at much higher rates. The census states that, 75.4 percent of Saskatchewan residents drive alone to work. This is compared to 67.4 percent of Canadians in general.

The number of Saskatchewan residents who commute to work using sustainable transportation (public transit, walk or bicycle) was 9.6 percent in 2016, down from 11.8

percent in 2006. This is far below the national rate of 19.3 percent, which is up from 18.7 percent in 2006.

LENGTH OF COMMUTE

In 2016, 43.9 percent of Saskatchewan residents spent less than 15 minutes commuting to work. Swift Current has the greatest percent share of short commutes at 74.8 percent, whereas Saskatoon had the lowest percent share of shortest commutes at 32.7 percent.
